

## **Point of Entry Manual**

The purpose of this Point of Entry Manual (POEM) is to facilitate collaboration among the agencies responsible in the transition service planning for children with disabilities. It should be utilized while addressing instruction, community service, other post school adult living objectives, functional vocational evaluation, related services, employment objectives, and acquisition of daily living skills in Individual Educational Plan development, and is designed in a directory format for easy use by the individuals responsible for planning transitional activities. This document will be reviewed at least annually for updated information.

However, we do not have enough staff or funds to do so.</p> <p>Therefore, DVR uses a process (Order of Selection) that allows persons with more severe functional limitations to be served before those with less severe limitations. DVR evaluates each eligible applicant to determine the severity of his or her functional limitations. This Order of Selection may indefinitely delay services to some individuals. The Division will notify all eligible persons for whom services will be delayed.</p> <p>DVR will look at how the following areas affect your ability to work:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
